WHAT TO DO IF YOUR PIPES ARE FROZEN

Turn on faucets. Allow a slight but steady stream of water to run through. Once thawed this will relieve pressure.

Open your cabinets. Allows warm air to circulate.

Increase the temperature in your home. Warms pipes within the walls.

Apply heat to your pipes.

EXAMPLES: Wrap a heating pad around pipes, or apply hot towels to pipe.

KEEP THEM CLEAR

In an emergency every second counts!

- Remove snow and ice from hydrant
- Clear an area approximately 3 feet around hydrant
- Clear a path from the hydrant to the street

MARKING YOUR OUTDOOR WATER METER PIT:

Mountain Regional Water requires that access to the meter pit be maintained by the homeowner. The meter pit should be accessible at all times. This will help us if we need to access your meter for maintenance or emergency shutoffs due to broken pipes and leaks. If you notice the meter lid is loose, ill-fitting, or missing, please contact us to report it. 435-940-1916.
